The exam is open-book, and you can consult whatever reference sources you like. The textbook and lecture notes (CCLE) include many models of what kind of answer we are looking for. Don’t forget that many topics in a printed book can be found using the Index.

The exam is meant to cover various of the analytic skills taught in the course, using a large batch of data from one single fictional, language, to be called Finalese. The rules of Finalese phonology are made up, but correspond to real rules in various languages.¹

You can download a segment inventory for Finalese from the CCLE web site, Week 10. We suggest you use it to check your use of features in writing rules.

Although the Finalese data are presented below all at once, the exam is arranged as a series of separate questions.

1. Guidelines for forming your answers

- When selecting the forms you will use for derivations, try to locate *simple* cases that don’t involve rules not relevant to the matter at hand.

- Be sure to check all uses of features in your rules using the Pheatures software.

2. Allophones of the rhotic phoneme

[r] and [ɹ] are allophones of the same underlying phoneme of Finalese. Perform a normal phonemic analysis of the kind taught in the course and included on the homeworks

We are deliberately making the question harder by not including the details of what “normal phonemic analysis” is — you’ve learned this in the course. Please refer to Chapters 2-3 of the text, the lecture handouts, and your completed homeworks. However, here are two particular specifications:

- You should include derivations that cover the various types of cases that arise (we suggest three.)
- The rule you write should include syllable structure, and the derivations should include syllabification, as in Chapter 13 of the text.

3. Stress

Write a stress rule for Finalese and illustrate it with two derivations. Follow the format of Chapter 14 of the text.

4. Vowel alternations

Finalese has multiple instances of the alternations [e] ~ [ə] and [o] ~ [ə]. These can be derived by rule. Figure out the needed rule and state it both formally and in words. Give underlying representations for all of the affixes, and for several stems (just a few; enough to make it clear how your analysis works). For each of these affixes and stems, list all of the allomorphs.

State whether your rule is a neutralization rule and explain why, giving an example.

I suspect this is the hardest question and I hereby offer a hint: to find the right UR’s, you must engage in *cobbling*; and you can review the concept of cobbling in the posted notes for Class 11, 2/10/21.

5. The status of palato-alveolars

The data include minimal pairs for alveolars vs. palato-alveolars, as follows:

Your task is to back up the claim made by X with analysis. State the phonological analysis that is needed, and illustrate your analysis by deriving examples (28a), (28b), (29a), and (29b).

To help out, we have collected the right-side local environments for the sounds [t d s tʃ dʒ ʃ]. They are as follows:

7. Doing the morphology
